These images reflect events and activities in Nunavut.

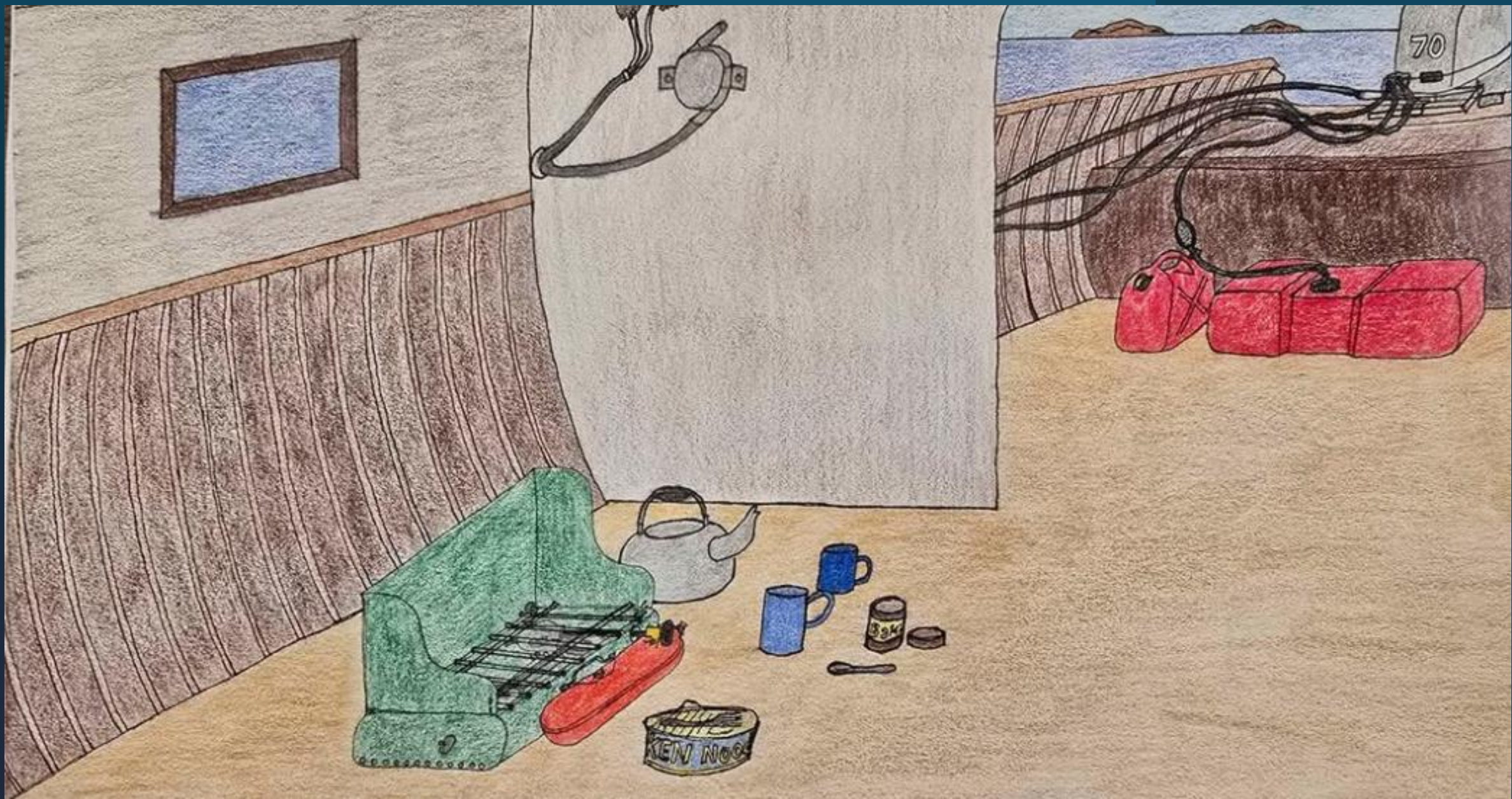
The art highlights vocabulary, concepts and culture that are important to Inuit.

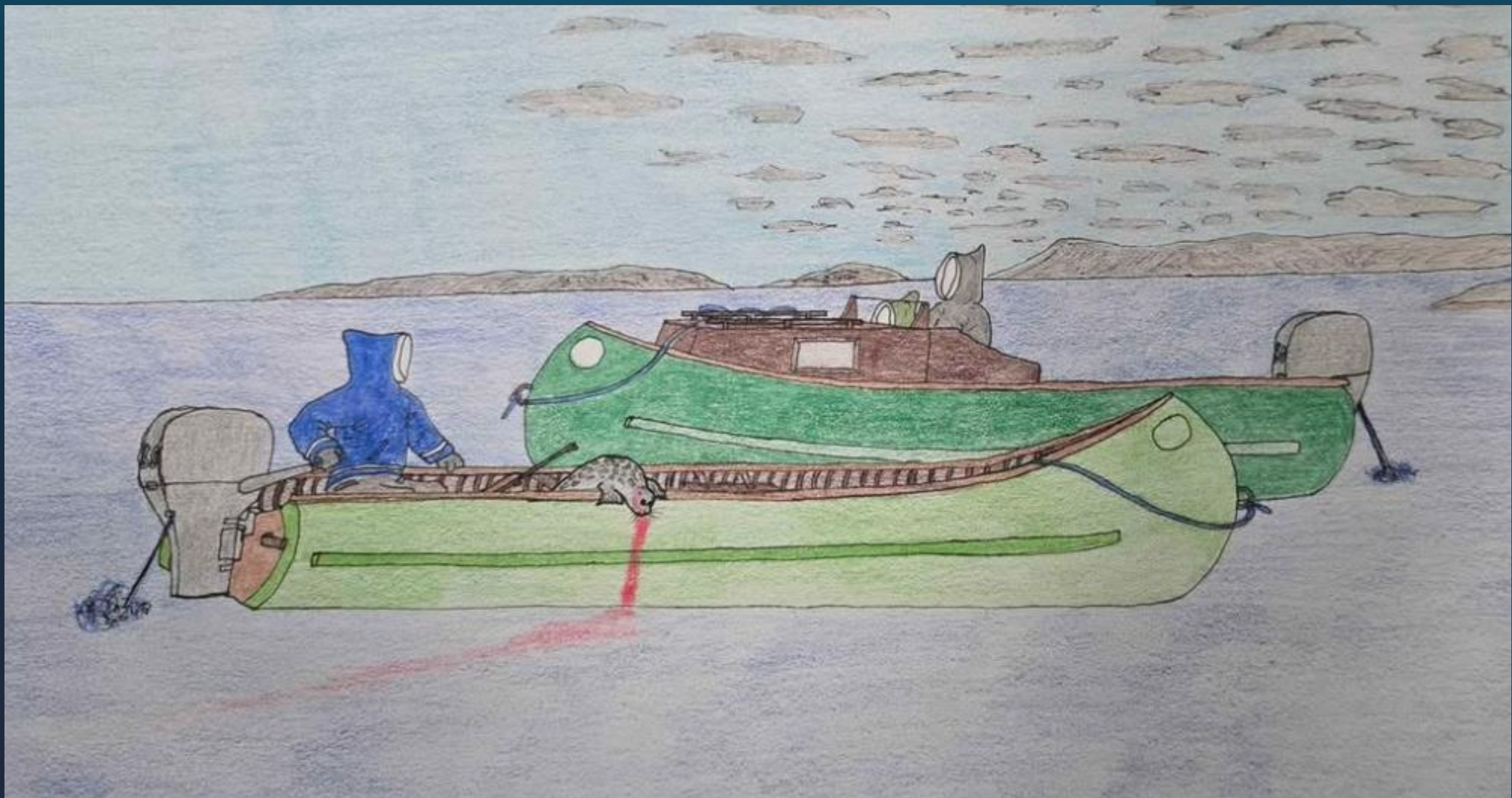
We want to support children to learn Inuktut as unilingual, bilingual or multilingual speakers.

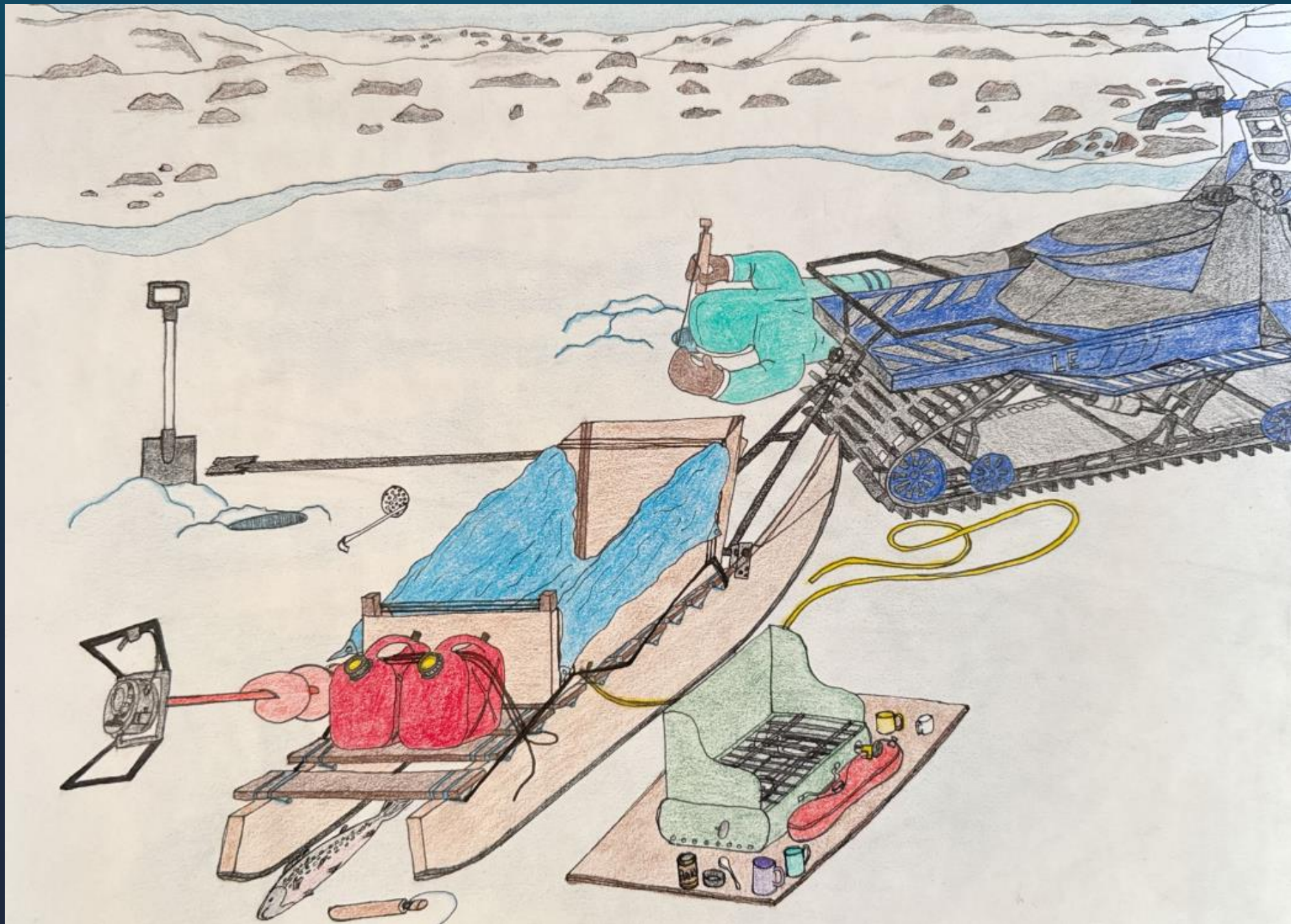

Artist: Oo Kierstead

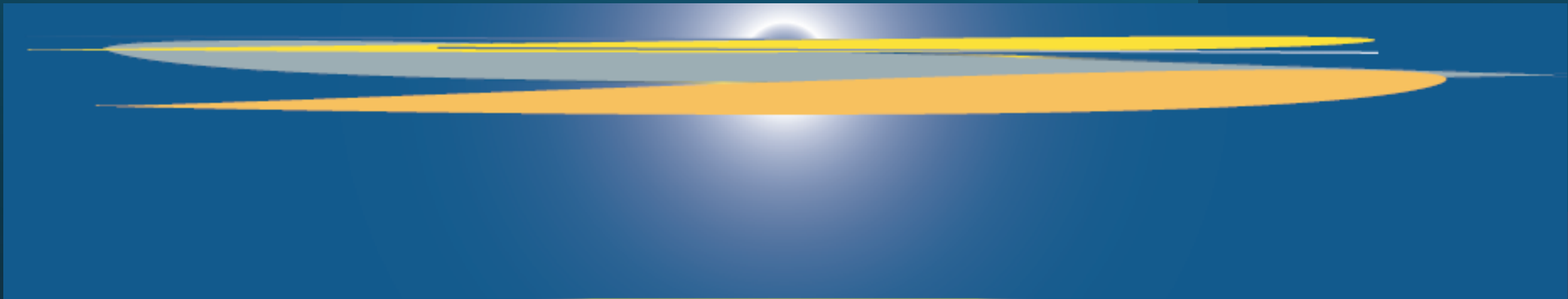
